

Brandon Patterson's 2013 Canadian Football League Mock Draft:

ROUND ONE

#1) Hamilton- Linden Gaydosh (DL)

*With the first overall pick, the Ti-Cats take a player ready to step in and improve their team immediately.

#2) Winnipeg- Ben D'Aguilar (DE/LB)

*With the second overall pick, the Bombers add depth to their line-up by selecting a prospect who can play more than one position. For the upcoming season, D'Aguilar would be able to step in on Special Teams and make an immediate impact. With NFL interest, D'Aguilar could fall down further in the draft.

#3) Montreal- Matt Sewell (OL)

*With their first selection in round one, the Alouettes select my top prospect. Sewell can go into Montreal and develop, play on Special Teams and learn from a solid veteran core of offensive linemen. Sewell has all the tools to become one of the top CFL non import offensive linemen. With NFL interest, Montreal is willing to wait on this prospect as this selection is based on years down the road.

#4) Saskatchewan- Mike Edem (LB)

*With their first round pick, the Riders select a player who can contribute to Special Teams immediately. Edem has great potential. His speed gives him the ability to cover key players in multiple packages.

#5) Montreal- Seydou Haidara (Rec)

*With their second pick in round one, the Alouettes select a player who can add depth to a position of need. In my opinion, the Montreal Alouettes will shop this draft pick.

#6) BC- Corey Watman (OL)

*With this selection, the Lions add depth to their aging offensive line. Watman can step in immediately on Special Teams while developing into a starting linemen.

#7) Calgary- Brent Urban (DL)

*Calgary drafts a future starting defensive linemen with this selection. When Urban plays for Calgary, he has the ability to step in immediately on Special Teams and join the rotation on Calgary's D-line.

#8) Toronto- Elie Ngoyi (DL)

*The Argos draft a player who can help fill their biggest need: defensive tackle. Ngoyi showed he has great strength by benching the most reps (40) at the 2013 CFL Combine.

#9) Ottawa- Brander Craighead (OL)

*Ottawa builds for the future. Selecting a solid offensive line prospect.
