

Brandon Patterson's 2013 Canadian Football League Mock Draft:

SECOND ROUND

#10) Edmonton- Brett Jones (OL)

*Edmonton continues to rebuild their offensive line. Drafting Jones helps the Eskimos step closer to an all Canadian offensive line.

#11) Winnipeg- Nolan MacMillan (OL)

*With this selection, Winnipeg takes a prospect with great potential at one of the most important positions for non-imports. MacMillan may need more time to develop than a player like Matt Sewell, but he's certainly worth the pick.

#12) BC- Jesse Joseph (DL)

*The lions use this draft pick to add depth to their defensive line. Joseph gives BC a player who can play along Jabar Westerman down the road.

#13) Calgary- Co Prime (LB)

*With this selection, Calgary takes a player with future potential. Prime is a player who could come in right away and start on Special Teams. Given valuable reps, he may become a starter. With NFL interest, this prospect may fall further down into the draft.

#14) Montreal- Andy Mulumba (DL)

*Montreal uses this selection to take a player who could potential start on their defensive line. While its a risk because of NFL interest, Mulumba at number 14 is too good for Montreal to pass on.

#15) Hamilton- Bo Lokombo (LB)

*The Ti-Cats gamble with the 15th overall selection, taking the Top Ranked Prospect. With years left at Oregon and NFL interest down the road, Hamilton may never get to see Lokombo. This risk comes with huge reward if Lokombo comes to the CFL in 2-3 years.

#16) Calgary- Hosan Shanin (DL)

*Calgary adds another solid prospect to their future defensive line by selecting Shanin at 16.

#17) Toronto- Stefan Charles (DL)

*Winning the 2012 Grey Cup gives Toronto the confidence to select an Elite Canadian prospect with significant NFL interest. This very risky move could turn out to be nothing more than hope down the road. But if Charles does end up in the CFL, the Argo's have their new star defensive tackle.

#18) Ottawa- Hunter Stewart (OL)

*The new Ottawa franchise continues to build for the future, selecting another offensive linemen.
