

Brandon Patterson's 2013 Canadian Football League Mock Draft:

ROUND THREE

#19) Hamilton- Micheal Dicroce (Rec)

*The Ti-Cats grab one of the top Canadian receivers with the 19th overall pick. With an aging Dave Stala, Dicroce can rotate in on offence and develop into a starting CFL receiver.

#20) Winnipeg- Stephen Alli (Rec)

*The Bombers grab a big receiver with decent hands and quick feet at number 20. At 6'6", Alli can cause matchup problems for visiting defenders. Alli is a project, and would need a few years to develop.

#21) BC- Kalonji Kashama (DL)

*BC continues to add to their defensive line depth by drafting Kashama. A good prospect for the Lions at 21. Has the poteinal to play quality minutes in a D-line rotation.

#22) Saskatchewan- Matt Vonk (OL)

*Riders use their 22nd overall pick to add depth to their offensive line. Vonk will not come into town to start. He needs time to develop and with a solid Canadian o-line in Saskatchewan, it's the perfect scenario.

#23) Montreal- Yannick Morin-Plante (Rec)

*With this selection, the Alouettes select another local receiving prospect. Drafting Morin-Plante gives the AL's long term depth at receiver for non-import Canadians.

#24) Edmonton- Kristopher Robertson (DB)

*Using the 24th overall pick, the Eskimos address two depth needs. A non-import defensive back and a player who can kick return. Robertson had a good E-Camp, which may lead to a CFL team taking him higher then pick #24.

#25) Calgary- Simon Le Marquand (Rec)

*The Stamps draft a good receiving prospect in Le Marquand at pick #25. He has good hands and does not drop many balls. This prospect will need time to develop, while doing so, he can play on multiple special teams.

#26) Edmonton- Steven Lumbala (RB)

*The Eskimos draft the top runningback at pick #26. Lumbala will add depth to a position that needs it with the departure of Jerome Messam.

#27) Ottawa- Connor Williams (DL)

*Ottawa drafts the best player they are able to select with the 27th overall pick. That being DL Connor Williams.
